What is Transitions of Care?

Transitions of Care is a specially designed palliative care program that provides education to patients and families to improve the quality of life through prevention and relief of suffering from a serious illness.

The Transitions of Care program uses an interdisciplinary approach to teach patients and their families how to manage the symptoms of a disease and the side effects of curative treatments. Our palliative care program also includes a hospice informational visit, psychosocial and spiritual support to help cope with the stress of living with an advanced illness.

Who Qualifies for Transitions of Care?

Transitions of Care services are offered to patients who have a life limiting illness and whose physician has determined that palliative care is appropriate.

Qualifying diagnoses include but are not limited to:

- Cancer
- Cardiovascular disease
- Pulmonary Disease
- Liver Disease
- Renal Disease
- Neurological Disease
- Alzheimer's Disease
- Stroke or Coma
- AIDS/HIV

Who Pays for Transitions of Care?
